# One Meter Yacht Championship - Friday 15th June - Ramsey Mooragh - 7:00pm.

This yachting event is held on a Friday evening at Ramsey Mooragh. Please make sure you turn up in time to make a prompt start. The race is for 1m yachts and is held over several laps of the Mooragh lake, depending on wind conditions.

The course was the usual round the island (clockwise) with a good beat to the top of the lake.


With a no incident start but with quite a few port and starboard tactics coming into play until the fleet spread out.






# **Radio Frequencies**

We have included with this newsletter the table showing what radio frequencies are currently being used by club members. Can you please check through the list and inform Brian King if the information is wrong so that he can bring the list up to date.

Unfortunately, we have had one or two radio clashes this year, which

has resulted in some boats performing erratically on the water. Every member is required to check the frequency which they are using is free **BEFORE** turning their transmitter on. If the peg board is in use, collect your peg first. If a clash does occur at an event, it can usually be sorted out by arranging with the person you clash with to share the time on the water, or alternatively by changing crystals.


The committee will have to decide if the static judging will be held at a later date, lets hope that there is a better entry next time.

# **Battery Safety**

Dave Foulis informs us that his boat recently caught fire for no apparent reason. Upon closer investigation he has discovered that there is a problem with some of his 'AA' size radio batteries. Dave is not the only person to have experienced difficulties, apparently this issue has also affected some modellers in the UK.

The problem is with 'AA' size rechargeable batteries with 'CP' or 'GP' marked on them. If you happen to have some of these batteries, you would be well advised to replace them with a different brand before your boat goes to Valhalla!
