Spit Head Review

This is a new naval event, due to be held on Sunday 13th August at Onchan Park starting at 6pm.

The club has invited the Governor to attend the evening and inspect the fleet. The competition itself will be judged by the Governor for the best naval vessel, and we intend to hold a grand 'sail past' with all vessels running in the same direction around the lake with an accompanying commentary over a PA system.

To assist with the running of the event, we require a list of all the naval vessels (RN & other navies) which will be attending the event along with the radio frequency and a brief description of the vessel which can be used as part of the commentary. Can you please send this information to Brian King as soon as possible.

We also need help with setting up tables (please bring a table if you have got one) and erecting the marquee, so it would be helpful if some members could turn up early to help. For further information, contact Brian King.

Although this event is intended to be a naval event, all models are welcome to help with the static display. With the Governor being a navy man, we expect him to be interested in all aspects of the models, both on and off the water. As a result of some members having more than one naval vessel, there may be more vessels available than skippers to sail them, so we may be looking for volunteer captains!

Report from the Scale Competition

Held in lovely weather, a great contrast to the previous Sunday evening's event (steering competition), it was sheer pleasure to be at Silverdale.

There was a good turn out with a good variety of models, some of them new to the club competition. Brian had his new Fairmile 'B', Doug had the German counterpart - the 'E' boat and Dave Quirk had his 'Perkasa'. Cameron had his new 'Guardsman' recently completed by Roy from the hull presented to Cameron at the last awards evening. Phil Walker, who was judging, had brought along his Steam Packet paddle 'Empress Queen' steamer built some years ago and had not been in the water for the same period. Very nice it looked on the water too. New member, Brian Swinden, had brought along his newly completed Trent lifeboat - the first model he has built. Les Quayle had been unable to attend but Jason had brought along his Douglas Head ferry for him, its first competitive outing. The other judge for the day, Dave Harding, had brought along his newly acquired 'Rosegarth' which he had spent the winter renovating and looked great with its plated and riveted hull, a la Mobile Marine Tugnology! With other 'regular' scale boats there were over 20 entries for the various classes.

Just to clarify a point, it must be remembered that once a boat has won a class in this annual competition it cannot be entered again for the same award. The difficulty is remembering 4-5 years on as Alan unfortunately found out. We will have to address this question before next year. A 'super' class as per Mannanan may be the answer.

Forthcoming Events
