Blackpool Model Show



Obituary

Members were saddened to learn that one of our Honorary members, Keith Jewell, passed away in February.

Keith was involved with the Manx Model Boat Club from the late 1980's onwards, and was an exceptional model builder building a large number of high quality models including HMS Illustrious and HMS Nurton, which are both still looked after by the club as club models.

Keith was instrumental in encouraging members to travel to UK model exhibitions and started the clubs attendance at the Ellesmere Port Model Boat show on the August bank holiday weekends. Having seen how well our club was received at UK exhibitions, Keith then went on to



organise the Mannanan event on the island inviting many UK modellers to come to the island and participate. Mannanan has been so successful that it has turned into an annual event.

In late 2000 Keith and his wife Shareen left the island to work in the UK, but they continued as Honorary club members and we were delighted when they returned to live on the island again. They have both continued to support the club, although Keith was not able to attend events in recent years.

Presentation of Memorial Benches

On Sunday 13th March, there was an excellent turn out of club members, family, friends and relatives of passed members at Silverdale to unveil the two benches. People started to gather from about 10am onwards watching the sailing on the water and having a good chat before pausing at 11am to listen to a few words and then having a round of applause before retiring to the cafe for a well deserved cup of tea.
