Obituary

A longstanding member of the club passed away recently after overcoming the amputation of a leg and various associated illnesses over the last few years. Vince Walmesley was a very enthusiastic member of the club, especially sailing his yachts on the Mooragh. For many years he ran the barber shop on Buck's Road and was a keen yachtsman. When he was unable to sail full-size yachts he turned to the models. He restored several vintage yachts and designed and built others.

After his amputation he sailed from his wheelchair at the Mooragh. He was interested in the historical side of models and built a lovely replica of an old fishing vessel which he donated to the Leece Museum in Peel. He also built a variety of other scale boats. Vince was a real gentleman, enthusiastic about any form of sailing and always keen to discuss various points with anyone interested. Unfortunately he did not survive his second amputation and we have lost a valued and enthusiastic modelling member of our club.


Scale Competition Results
